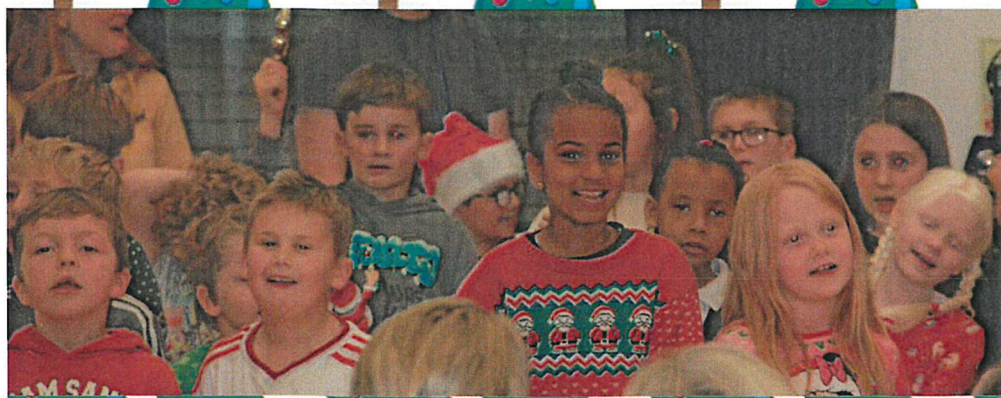


We celebrated attendance this week where children with 96-99% received a certificate and children with 100% received a certificate and present and their parents were invited to attend our assembly



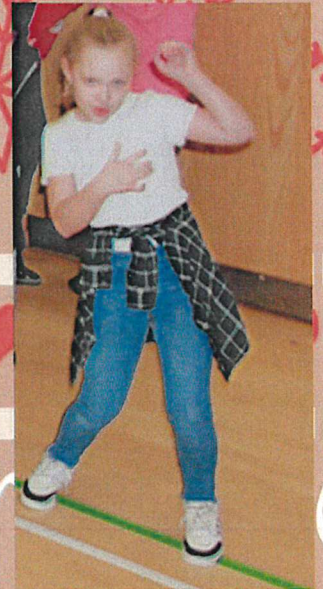
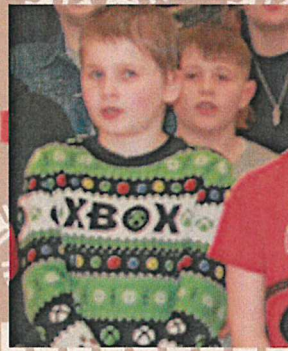
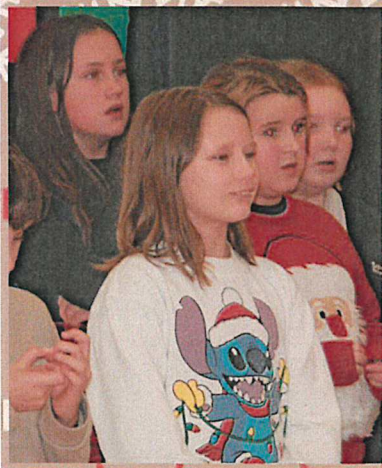

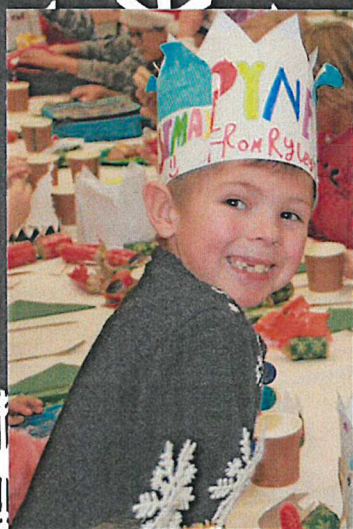
