In the video, we see how the tone of what we say, the way we whisper to each other and the way we do not 'call out' meanness can be interpreted as bullying. It's a bit like the adage about the toothpaste. Words that are unkind hurt. If we let the toothpaste out of the tube it's impossible to put it back in. We must think before we speak and act, make sure what we say and don't say, do and don't do, cannot be interpreted as unkindness. The simple way to think about it is to treat all people the way you would like to be treated yourself.

I love the end of term as it is usually the point at which children produce their final 'endpoint' pieces of work. Yesterday was Greek day for Years 5 and 6, I got asked to judge some Dioramas in Year 4 and 5 and was mesmerised by some persuasive writing in Years 3 and 4. Your children are talented artists, authors, actors, musicians, scientists, mathematicians, historians and sportspeople. We have an abundance of talent in our school and staff will be working hard next term to plan for opportunities that enables our pupils to demonstrate and realise their talents.





